PRIZE COMPETITIONS

Marjorie England Dissection Prize

An opportunity for **IAS Members and Non-Members alike** to produce a dissection and to have it considered with others by a panel of experienced Anatomists - the dissection itself must be the **sole work of the entrant** and may be an animal or a human specimen and will be judged against published criteria, technical and intellectual complexity and usefulness as a teaching aid amongst others.

Entry will be by photograph which should be accompanied by an appropriate title.

Fellows Museum Prize

Examples of museum preparations for the Fellows Prize include:

- **Osteological preparation** - either dry or fluid mounted
- **Dissection/pathological specimen** mounted in a sealed museum display jar
- **Specimens** which have been **plastinated, air-dried, freeze-dried, plastic or resin embedded**
- **Corrosion casts/models (anatomical/pathological)**

The museum preparation may be either a single specimen or multiple specimens which together form a specific museum display.

The entire display should be included in the photograph(s) i.e. stand, base, jar, case, display panel etc.

IAS Open Competition

This gives entrants the opportunity to display **any type of work which they have carried out** – this can include anything from the construction of a set of shelves, a set of histology slides, a contribution to posters, publications or books, to the making of a computer programme or a video film.

Entry will either be by photograph or presentation of the actual item, e.g. book, poster, video etc.

Where the display shows the entrants work as a contribution towards a project – a clear statement must be made, as to the part played by the individuals involved.

It may not be possible to keep this category entirely anonymous, but every effort will be made to do so.

IAS Student Dissection Prize

An opportunity for **undergraduate students – individually or in a group** - to produce a dissection and to have it considered with others by a panel of experienced Anatomists - **the dissection may be an animal or a human specimen** and will be judged against published criteria, technical and intellectual complexity and usefulness as a teaching aid amongst others.

Entry will be by photograph which should be accompanied by an appropriate title.

How to enter:

Entry is by photograph, which will be printed on A3 sized paper and displayed at the meeting. **All entries must be created in Microsoft PowerPoint and adhere to the criteria outlined on the IAS website.** To accompany the entry please provide an A5 landscape card created in Microsoft Word detailing the category you are entering and the following:

- Name
- Place of work/study
- Position
- Acknowledgements

All poster entries, plus accompanying name cards must be e-mailed secretary@anatomical-sciences.org.uk before **Friday 10th August 2012**. Only entries sent to this address will be accepted.

Entry to the competition is free to IAS members and £5 for non-members.

All entrants will receive a Certificate of Participation from the IAS
